- An air defence identification zone (ADIZ) is a defined area of airspace over land and water that a country declares and controls in the interest of national security.
- Its main purpose is to identify, locate, and control any civil aircraft in the designated area. ADIZs are established unilaterally, meaning they are declared by a single country without the consent or agreement of other nations.
- They may also extend beyond a country's territorial borders to give the country more time to respond to potentially hostile aircraft.
- ADIZs are not recognized by any international treaty or body, and the concept is not defined in any international law. The United States established the first ADIZ on December 27, 1950, during the Korean War.
- Currently, around 20 countries and regions have ADIZs, including Canada, India, Japan, Pakistan, Bangladesh, Finland, Norway, the United Kingdom, China, South Korea, Taiwan, the United States, Sweden, Iceland, and Iran. In addition, Russia and North Korea also have unofficial ADIZs.
- ADIZs typically only cover undisputed territory and do not apply to foreign aircraft that are not intending to enter a
  country's territorial airspace.
- They also do not overlap with other ADIZs. It is important to note that ADIZs should not be confused with flight information regions (FIRs), which are used to manage air traffic.
